ROA04 - FAR AWAY SIGHTSEEING ISLAND TOUR



English

In this approximately five-hour excursion you 'll visit Punta Gorda and Oakridge, two of Roatán 's historical fishing villages. You 'll also take a boat ride to a private island for a bite to eat and downtime. Excursion details See more of Roatán, the largest of the Bay Islands of Honduras, on this roughly five-hour excursion that features visits to two villages on the north and south coasts, plus a trip to an island beach resort. A roughly 35-minute transfer transports you to a panoramic viewpoint, where you 'll pause for around 15 minutes before continuing the journey for approximately 20 minutes, arriving at the village of Punta Gorda. On the northern coast of the island, Punta Gorda is known as a Garifuna community, where the Afro-indigenous inhabitants are descended from a group of deportees who were exiled by the British following a quashed rebellion on the Caribbean island of St Vincent. Spend 30 minutes or so exploring the village before an approximately 20-minute traditional dance performance to a backdrop of rhythmic drumming. Next, it 's a brief transfer across the island to Oakridge on the south coast. Often referred to as the 'Venice of Roatán ', this photogenic fishing village is known for its colourful houses on stilts and its network of waterways. Following a brief stop to admire the views, it 's an approximately 25-minute transfer to Lionfish Landing. There, you 'll make the short boat trip to Big French Key, a private island with a beach club just off the southern coast. The island's name is believed to originate from a Frenchman who arrived in the 1760s. After a roughly 20-minute break for a snack and drink, you 'll have an hour or so to enjoy the beach at leisure and relax. Finally, there 's a brief boat crossing back to the main island and an approximately 30-minute return journey to the port. Important Information: This tour reaches a panoramic point located in a secluded part of the island, the road is paved for the most part and unpaved for the last 2 miles. During the stop at French Cay, it is possible to purchase other drinks, food or rent kayaks and snorkeling equipment. Guests using a wheelchair are advised that they must be accompanied by a paying companion to help with getting on and off the bus and that wheelchairs must be collapsible/foldable since the bus has neither a ramp nor a lift. Guests using a wheelchair who would like to participate in this tour are requested to contact the Shore Excursions ' Desk promptly once they are on board so that arrangements can be made. Given the island 's infrastructure and narrow, winding roads, smaller buses are used for transportation in Roatan, allowing for easier navigation and more efficient travel through the island.

ROA05 - GLASS BOTTOM BOAT, CAMEOS, AND RUM CAKE



English

Experience the underwater wonders of the Caribbean Sea on a tour aboard a glass-bottomed boat during this excursion, lasting approximately three hours. You 'll also visit the West End seaside village for a quick photo stop, and the Roatan Rum Company for a tasting. Excursion Details The Caribbean Sea is home to a kaleidoscope of coral reefs, tropical fish, sea turtles and other marine creatures. This excursion of around three hours takes you below the waterline to experience its sights via a semi-submersible vessel. Afterwards you 'll get to visit a seaside village and a factory that creates decorative objects known as cameos. Begin with a drive of about 15 minutes to the Flowers Bay Roatan sign, where you 'll have a quick photo stop off the bus to snack some pictures and enjoy the view. Then, it 's back on the bus for an approximately 20-minute transfer to a boat dock, where your glass-bottomed vessel awaits, ready for your trip of around half an hour. Once onboard, descend a few steps into an underwater observatory, where you can view aquatic scenes, coral formations and potentially even marine creatures (although sightings cannot be guaranteed). During the tour, you 'll learn more about the Caribbean waters you 're sailing through and the marine life within them from an onboard guide. Back on dry land, you 'll have approximately 15 minutes to enjoy the view and visit some of the nearby shops at West End Village or to remain onboard the bus for a quick drive through the village before returning to the village entrance to pick up those passengers who decided to get off. Afterwards, there 's a drive of about 15 minutes to the Roatan Rum Company, where you 'll have the opportunity to sample some rum cake. Finally, a 20-minute transfer takes you to a factory specialising in cameos, decorative objects intricately carved by artisans. Here, you 'll spend around 30 minutes watching these skilled craftspeople at work as they create items from coral and conch shells, and there 's the chance to purchase some of the objects afterwards. A short transfer returns you to the port. Important Information: In case the glass bottom boat ride cannot be operated due to bad weather, it will be replaced with a stop at the Institute of Marine Science and the Roatan Museum. Given the island 's infrastructure and narrow, winding roads, smaller buses are used for transportation in Roatan, allowing for easier navigation and more efficient travel through the island. This tour is not recommended for guests who suffer from claustrophobia.

ROA06 - PROTECTOURS: HIKING & ARCHAEOLOGY ADVENTURE



English

Excursion details Enjoy a trek through jungle landscapes on this approximately three-hour excursion to Mayan Eden Eco Park. Your trip begins with a transfer of 15 minutes or so to the park, located near Coxen Hole, in the southwest of the island. After a roughly 15-minute briefing you'll embark on a guided hike of approximately 65 minutes, where you'll have the chance to admire replicas of Maya artefacts and a hanging bridge that cuts through the canopy. As you make your way along the trail, keep your camera ready for possible wildlife sightings. Then there's a short walk to a panoramic viewpoint, offering vistas of the Caribbean coastline. Following your time at the viewpoint you'll visit nearby Coxen Hole, named after the 17th-century English pirate Captain John Coxen. You can choose to be dropped off at Coxen Hole and explore further, before independently making the short walk back to the ship, or you can choose to simply take the 15-minute return transfer drive back to the port. Important Information: The trail at the park is not man-made, therefore, guests should wear closed toe and comfortable walking shoes. While there, please watch your head, as there are a few places where trees and branches will be in the pathway. It is recommended that guests bring insect repellent. During the hike, guests will walk approximately 1 km on uneven terrain. Given the island's infrastructure and narrow, winding roads, smaller buses are used for transportation in Roatan, allowing for easier navigation and more efficient travel through the island.

**ROA09 - SHIPWRECK SNORKEL & BEACH**

English

Spend time in and above the Caribbean Sea on this excursion of around five hours, during which you'll snorkel out to a shipwreck. The snorkelling takes place off a private tropical island, where you'll get the chance to relax afterwards. Excursion details Measuring just four and a half hectares, Big French Key is a private cay (a small island) set off the southern coast of Roatán, characterised by a mix of greenery and white-sanded beaches. Get to know this tropical location and its surrounding waters on a snorkelling excursion, lasting approximately five hours. Start with a drive of about 30 minutes to reach the landing for your boat transfer. After a short crossing you'll arrive at Big French Key's beach club, where you'll be welcomed with a fruit punch. Those new to snorkelling will get some introductory guidance over 15 minutes or so, before a boat ride of around 15 minutes takes you to the snorkelling site. Then begins your guided snorkelling session of approximately one hour. During this time, you'll be able to view the wreck of the Prince Albert - a large tanker that was intentionally sunk in 1985 to create a site of interest for divers and snorkellers - as well as nearby reefs, before a boat transfer of around 15 minutes back to Big French Key. You'll then have approximately one hour of free time to relax on the beach. Sit back on the sand and enjoy the sunshine or return to the water for another swim, if the mood takes you. Afterwards, make the short boat crossing back to Roatán, where a drive of around 30 minutes returns to the port. Important Information: Guests must be at least 8 years old to participate in the snorkeling part of this tour. To participate to the snorkeling tour you must be able to swim. All participating guests will be required to sign a waiver which may only be available in English. The snorkeling equipment provided (fins, snorkel, mask and snorkel flotation vest) is included, however, it can be kept only for the approximately one hour guided snorkelling time. Given the island's infrastructure and narrow, winding roads, smaller buses are used for transportation in Roatan, allowing for easier navigation and more efficient travel through the island. The visibility of the shipwreck is weather permitting and in case of adverse weather the snorkeling site can be changed with coral reef barrier snorkeling or lobster snorkeling.

English

Excursion details This approximately five-hour excursion is a chance to get to know the island of Roatán through a variety of activities and experiences. Begin with a transfer of around 35 minutes, which takes you to a panoramic viewpoint, where you'll have approximately 15 minutes to capture the island's coastline on camera. It's then a journey of roughly 20 minutes to an iguana sanctuary, where Roatán's warm climate and vegetation offer an ideal habitat for these largely herbivorous reptiles. Guests can see the iguanas up-close and possibly even feed them. After around 20 minutes with the iguanas, you'll make a brief visit to the in-sea tarpon aquarium. Then it's a short drive to The Buccaneer, a beachfront resort in French Harbour, which was established in 1967 as the Posada del Bucanero, one of the island's first hotels. You'll have around 15 minutes here to dip into the history of the Bay Islands at the venue's on-site museum or simply relax by the water, before a journey of around 20 minutes to Las Palmas, a resort on the south of the island. From there, you'll embark on a roughly 20-minute boat ride along the coast, during which time you can admire the mangroves and spot a shipwreck in the waters of a nearby bay. After returning to Las Palmas, you'll enjoy a musical performance of around 20 minutes by the Garifuna, whose origin incorporates cultural elements of indigenous Caribbean and African groups. Central to the show is the Punta, the energetic dance characterised by fast, rhythmic movements. Then enjoy a brief break for complimentary refreshments before approximately 75 minutes of free time on the beach at Las Palmas to enjoy the sea views or relax in the shade. This free time can also be used for shopping, if you prefer. Finally, a journey of around 20 minutes returns to the port to conclude the excursion. Important Information: it is recommended that guests bring a bathing suit, towel, sunscreen, and cash or credit cards for any additional purchases. Given the island's infrastructure and narrow, winding roads, smaller buses are used for transportation in Roatan, allowing for easier navigation and more efficient travel through the island.

ROA16 - BFK BEACH BREAK, LUNCH & SIGHTSEEING BOAT RIDE



English

Excursion details This excursion, lasting approximately five and a half hours, is a prime opportunity for relaxation on the small tropical island of Big French Key. An approximately 30-minute drive from the port transports you to the dock for the short boat trip over to Big French Key. Back in the 18th century, a French settler is believed to have moved to the island, giving it its name. On this tropical retreat you'll be able to look out at the Caribbean Sea and the island's smaller neighbour, Little French Key. Enjoy around two and a half hours of free time on the beach for swimming, playing volleyball, sunbathing, kayaking on the calm lagoon (kayaks are available on a first-come, first-served basis) or simply relaxing. Afterwards, there'll be the chance to enjoy the island from a different viewpoint on a roughly 20-minute sightseeing boat trip along the coast to admire the mangroves and nearby bays. Following the boat trip, enjoy a buffet lunch at a palapa - an open-sided beach restaurant - over approximately one hour. Then make the roughly 15-minute boat crossing back to the main island for a drive of around 30 minutes back to the port. Important Information: It is recommended that guests bring swimwear, a towel, sunscreen, insect repellent, a hat, sunglasses, and cash for purchases. Given the island's infrastructure and narrow, winding roads, smaller buses are used for transportation in Roatan, allowing for easier navigation and more efficient travel through the island.

ROA23 - TABYANA BEACH DAY



English

Excursion details Enjoy an escape to Tabyana Beach on this approximately five-hour excursion, which is the perfect excuse to sit back and appreciate the coastal vibe of a Honduran island. Tabyana Beach is set on West Bay Beach, on the northwestern side of Roatan. After being picked up at the pier, you'll be transported directly to Tabyana Beach on a drive of around 30 minutes. Once arrived, ease into approximately three hours and 50 minutes of free time, to be spent however you like. Cool off with a swim, stroll on the soft sands and admire the far-reaching coastal views, or venture deeper into the water by renting snorkelling equipment (at guests' own expense). You'll also be able to enjoy a buffet lunch during your time at the beach, keeping you well-fuelled for a relaxing day. A transfer of around 30 minutes then returns to the port, concluding the excursion. Important Information: lockers and snorkel gear are available at additional cost not covered by the price of the tour. Guests must bring a bathing suit, sunscreen, cash or credit cards for additional purchases, and their own towel. Guests must be at least 12 years of age to snorkel. Total time at the beach: approximately 4 hours. Iced tea and lemonade are included. Additional beverages are available for purchase. Given the island's infrastructure and narrow, winding roads, smaller buses are used for transportation in Roatan, allowing for easier navigation and more efficient travel through the island.

ROA27 - EXPLORING ROATÁN'S FISHING VILLAGES



English

Excursion details In this excursion of approximately five and a half hours, you'll have the chance to discover Roatán's fishing villages on the north and south coasts. Each has its own unique culture and atmosphere, and there's a chance to sample local food, too. A transfer of around 35 minutes takes you to the first stop - a panoramic viewpoint, where you can admire and photograph Roatán's landscapes for around 15 minutes. Next, travel for around 20 minutes to Punta Gorda, a village on the northern coast and Roatán's oldest permanent settlement. It's known as a Garifuna community (the Garifuna people are descendants of Africans and Caribbean indigenous groups), and its local residents are sometimes referred to as the guardians of this unique culture. Enjoy some scenic views during a brief interlude at a palapa, a traditional open-sided structure with a thatched roof, before watching a fishing demonstration by a local fisherman for around 15 minutes. Afterwards, the catch of the day will be cooked up for you in a tasting session lasting 20 minutes or so. Following a brief transfer, the next stop is Oakridge on the south of the island. Nicknamed the 'Venice of Roatán', this pretty village is known for its brightly painted wooden houses on stilts. Sip on a fruit punch as you take in the views for 20 minutes or so, before an approximately one-hour guided trip on a traditional cayuco boat to explore Oakridge by water. Today, the village is home to tight-knit fishing families, but as you'll learn, it was once a hideaway for pirates, who - legend has it - cut the mangrove tunnels you'll travel through, using their machetes. The guided tour continues through these tunnels toward neighbouring Jonesville, where you'll enjoy a seafood lunch at another palapa over approximately one hour. Finally, a brief transfer to the parking area is followed by a return journey to the port of approximately 45 minutes. Important Information: The order of stops may vary. Guests are recommended to bring sunscreen, sunglasses, and a hat. Hole in the Wall offers a cash bar. Guests should inform the Shore Excursions Desk in advance should they have any food allergies. Menu subject to change. Given the island's infrastructure and narrow, winding roads, smaller buses are used for transportation in Roatan, allowing for easier navigation and more efficient travel through the island.

ROA31 - VIP BOAT TOUR

Design your perfect boat tour on this excursion of approximately six hours. You'll help build the tour schedule based around your preferences on the day, with additional time afterwards for snorkelling, refreshments and a light lunch at a restaurant. You 'll also have unlimited complimentary drinks throughout. Excursion Details Be the captain of your day 's itinerary on this special excursion, lasting around six hours. The action starts with a transfer of around 30 minutes to the boat dock, where you 'll board your touring boat and - over 30 minutes or so - enjoy a warm welcome along with a welcome drink and an introductory orientation talk. Then start customising an itinerary with the boat 's captain. A range of options will be available, and when you 've settled on your plan, an approximately hour-long navigation based on your preferences will begin. After your bespoke sailing tour of the area, you 'll be able to delve into Roatán 's underwater delights on a snorkelling journey for around one hour, also including some downtime for relaxation. Following this, there 's another hour set aside for some welcome indulgences, including refreshments and gourmet snacks onboard your ship. If you choose to, your party can then make a stop at a nearby local restaurant for lunch over 90 minutes or so (please note this will incur an additional charge at guests ' own expense). For the entire day you 'll be able to enjoy unlimited complimentary beverages, including alcoholic drinks. Finally, returns back to the port with a land transfer. Important Information: The price of this tour is per person and includes an speaking captain and crew, lunch, open bar (unlimited beers, cocktails, soft drinks, water, juice, and iced tea), and guided snorkeling tour with gear. Alcohol will only be served after the snorkeling portion of this tour. It is recommended that guests bring a bathing suit, towel, sunscreen, and cash or credit cards for any additional purchases. The minimum age to consume alcohol is 21 years old.

ROA32 - PRISTINE BAY BEACH DAY WITH LUNCH

Excursion details Treat yourself to a day of fun and freedom on this approximately six-hour excursion, taking place at a beach club on the Honduran island of Roatán. Begin with a transfer of around 30 minutes to your destination, the beach club of the extensive Pristine Bay resort. On arrival you'll be welcomed with a non-alcoholic fruit punch and given orientation information about the beach club (which covers approximately 25,000 square feet) for around 15 minutes. Then spend approximately three hours of free time making the most of the beach club and its amenities. These include an infinity pool, a small waterpark suitable for families and children, a 'Kids'Zone' play area in one of the pools, a sports field (with courts for tennis, basketball and pickleball - a paddle-based sport which blends parts of tennis, ping pong and badminton) and, of course, the beach itself, which boasts palms and white sands. After the free time comes to an end, there's around one hour to enjoy lunch, accompanied by either a beer or soft drink. Following lunch is a unique opportunity. Spend approximately 30 minutes trying your hand at 'splash golf'- the nickname given to hitting golf balls into a designated lake area at Pete's Place Driving Range, attached to a hotel within the resort. You'll be given a bucket of 20 golf balls to help perfect your swing, made even more enjoyable by the addition of a scenic coastal backdrop. Those who prefer to spend more time at the resort relaxing instead of at the driving range are welcome to do so. After the time at the driving range, there's a brief transfer to a nearby panoramic viewpoint, where you can spend a short time admiring views overlooking the resort's golf course. Finally, a transfer of approximately 30 minutes returns to the port, concluding the excursion. Important Information: Children must be accompanied and supervised by a parent or guardian. Guests are recommended to bring a bathing suit, sunblock, a towel, and a change of clothes. Other amenities include, a mini water park, tennis courts, basketball courts, and a volleyball facility; however, equipment is not provided, so guests wishing to use these facilities should bring their own. Given the island's infrastructure and narrow, winding roads, smaller buses are used for transportation in Roatan, allowing for easier navigation and more efficient travel through the island.

Set sail along the coastline of Roatán aboard the Jolly Roger Catamaran for a relaxing day of snorkeling and sailing. Cruise to a section of the Roatán National Marine Park that's only accessible by boat, where you'll have approximately 1 hour for exploring and snorkeling the waters, known for its vibrant marine life. You'll be guided by experienced staff and a safety team to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience. After your underwater adventure, enjoy a buffet lunch on board. As you sail back to port, unwind to the sounds of Caribbean music and take in the sea breeze. Before disembarking, guests can receive a link to complimentary digital photos taken during the tour and a one Lempira banknote as a small cultural keepsake from the day. Please note: The maximum weight for the zipline is 260 lbs. Closed-toe shoes are mandatory for the zipline activity. Tripods and drones are not permitted on this tour. It is recommended that guests bring a bathing suit, towel, biodegradable sunscreen, insect repellent, and water shoes. Transfer by ferry to Playa del Carmen lasts approximately 45 minutes and could possibly be rough depending on the sea conditions. Once in mainland it is an approximately 1-hour bus drive each way to/from Tankah Park, for a total travel time from the ship to and from Tankah Park of approximately 1 hour and 45 minutes each way. Excursion details Found off the northern coast of Honduras, the island of Roatán may measure just 40 miles or so in length, but it 's still known for its acclaimed beaches, one of which you 'll be enjoying on this excursion of around four hours. A transfer drive of around 20 minutes starts things off, arriving at a beach club where you 'll be welcomed with a fruit punch and given a briefing about the venue, lasting around 20 minutes. Then, ease into approximately three hours of leisure time, to be used however you see fit. Wandering across the white sands and admiring the Caribbean coastal views is a good way to begin, perhaps followed by a refreshing dip in the sea. You 'll also have access to a complimentary beach chair during your time here, so feel free to sit back and enjoy the sunshine. As the beach club also houses a souvenir shop, you 'll be able to browse and buy gifts and mementos of your time spent in Roatán. Once the free time comes to an end, a transfer drive of approximately 20 minutes returns to the port, concluding the excursion. Important Information: You are recommended to bring swimwear, a towel, sunscreen, insect repellent, a sunhat, sunglasses and cash for purchases. Guests using a wheelchair are advised that they must be accompanied by a paying helper to provide assistance with getting on and off the coach and that wheelchairs must be collapsible/foldable since the coach has neither a ramp nor a lift. Guests using a wheelchair who would like to participate in this tour are requested to contact the Shore Excursions ' Desk promptly once they are on board so that arrangements can be made. Given the island 's infrastructure and narrow, winding roads, smaller buses are used for transportation in Roatan, allowing for easier navigation and more efficient travel through the island.

**ROAEA - EASY & ACCESSIBLE: ROATAN**

English

Explore the Honduran island of Roatán during this excursion of around four hours, which is designed to be accessible for all guests. You'll get to see iguanas, spend time on the beach and grab photos of the tropical landscape. Excursion details This approximately four-hour excursion is a chance to visit some of the sights and attractions of Roatán - an island located off the northern coast of Honduras - in an easy format. The excursion is accessible for guests with limited mobility by using a route that avoids steps and includes accessible bathrooms. The excursion starts with a drive of around 35 minutes to a viewpoint where you can take in panoramic vistas of the Caribbean Sea and surrounding scenery for around 15 minutes. From here, it's about a 15-minute drive to an iguana park, where you'll spend approximately 20 minutes observing and learning more about these fascinating lizards. Next is an approximately 25-minute drive to the Las Palmas Beach Hotel at Dixon Cove. After enjoying welcome refreshments for about 15 minutes, you'll have approximately one hour and 40 minutes of free time to spend however you like - browse nearby shops, grab a bite to eat or a drink (at guests' own expense) or simply relax on the beach, enjoying the sunshine and sea views. Afterwards, a transfer drive of around 20 minutes returns to the port. Important Information: This tour is designed to be accessible for guests with limited mobility or using folding wheelchairs. Guests must be able to climb steps to board the bus. The tour route avoids steps and stairs. Accessible bathrooms with wide doors for wheelchairs are present along the tour route. Guides are not allowed to push wheelchairs. The order of the sites viewed or visited may vary. Lunch/snack costs are not included in the tour price. Given the island's infrastructure and narrow, winding roads, smaller buses are used for transportation in Roatan, allowing for easier navigation and more efficient travel through the island.
